Subject: Child Discipline-Time Out

Policy

The administration of discipline will be conducted in a professional, safe, and respectful manner.

Procedure

- 1. Time out is the only acceptable discipline method that is used and <u>only used in extreme situations</u> (see Policy on Behavior Management Support and Discipline).
- 2. Time out will be one (1) minute per age. (3 years = 3 minutes)
- 3. Time out will be conducted in an area where the child is near peers and visible to staff.
- 4. Child will not be placed directly in a corner.
- 5. Child will face the classroom to allow the child to observe class activity.
- 6. Staff will not discipline in a manner that is frightening, humiliating, or associated with food, rest, or toileting.
- 7. Spanking or any other form of physical punishment is strictly prohibited by all staff.
- 8. Flicking, pinching, or thumping a child will be considered a form of physical discipline.
- 9. Staff and parents will share positive approaches to discipline.
- 10. Staff will identify parents who use other approaches to discipline and discuss with them appropriate responses to behavior.
- 11. Offenses of child discipline measures constitutes a written warning and up to and possibly immediate termination of employment.
- 12. One written discipline warning of child safety or inappropriate discipline, that is considered too harsh or severe, may constitute immediate termination of employment with Tri-County Head Start/Early Head Start.

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
