

Exposure Control Plan

As required by the Child Care Licensing Handbook, recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and in accordance with the Occupational Health and Safety Administration (OSHA), Bloodborne Pathogens standard 29 CFR 1910.1030, the following exposure plan has been developed by

Incidents where exposure may occur:

- When applying direct pressure to a bleeding wound, cleaning or bandaging a wound
- When assisting someone who is bleeding
- Cleaning spills of blood or other potentially infectious materials
- Rescue breathing or CPR
- Skin puncture due to a human bite
- When changing a diaper or wiping a child's nose

Compliance:

Standard Precautions is an approach to infection control in which all human blood and certain human bodily fluids are treated as if known to be infectious for HIV, Hepatitis B, Hepatitis C and other bloodborne pathogens.

Exposure Control Practices:

- Handwashing: use running water and soap. The use of hand sanitizer is acceptable if running water is not available.
- Gloves will be available and are located: _____.
- Gloves should be worn when changing diapers, assisting in the bathroom, when cleaning up vomit or any time blood is present.
- First Aid Kit is located: _____.

- Contaminated laundry will be properly bagged, washed or disposed of.
- Cleaning and disinfecting of exposed area: (wear gloves)
 - Clean using water to remove contamination; followed by a general cleaning using soap and water. When appropriate flush solution down the drain.
 - Disinfect surface using a solution mixed according to manufacture's instructions. Dispose of all towels/tissues and gloves properly.

Post Exposure Follow-Up

An exposure incident means a specific eye, mouth, other mucous membrane nonintact skin, or needle or other sharp object with blood or other potentially infectious material that results from dealing with an incident where exposure has occurred.

An accident/incident form will be written and given to the parent/guardian to sign on the same day of occurrence. The parent/guardian will also be called.

If any child care personnel (substitute/employee) or I become exposed to any blood or human bodily fluids, the person's primary doctor will be called and child care personnel will follow the doctor's instructions.

Acknowledgement

I understand the proper procedures in the event there is exposure to blood and potentially infectious fluids. I understand that Child Care Personnel are required to be educated on the home's exposure plan regarding standard precautions before beginning to work and annually thereafter.
